## General Education Mission Statement

## General Education Learning Outcomes

LSSU graduates will be able to:

- **Oral Communication Outcome:** Communicate competently in a variety of contexts
- **Written Communication Outcome:** Analyze, develop, and produce rhetorically complex texts
- **Humanities Outcome:** Analyze, evaluate, and explain human aesthetics and its historical development
- **Diversity Outcome:** View the world from cultural perspectives other than their own
- **Natural Science Outcome:** Incorporate empirical evidence in the analysis of the causes and consequences of natural phenomena
- **Social Science Outcome:** Think critically and analytically about the causes and consequences of human behavior
- **Mathematics Outcome:** Analyze situations symbolically and quantitatively in order to make decisions and solve problems

## General Education Requirements (Bachelors Degree)

Students planning to earn a degree are required to complete general education requirements with a general education GPA of 2.00 or higher. The general education requirements will be considered satisfied for students transferring to LSSU with MTA or MACRAO. The general education requirements will be considered satisfied for students who have already earned a bachelor degree (honors bachelor degree from a Canadian University).
