General Education Learning Outcomes

LSSU graduates will be able to:

- · Oral Communication Outcome: Communicate competently in a variety of contexts
- · Written Communication Outcome: Analyze, develop, and produce rhetorically complex texts
- · Humanities Outcome: Analyze, evaluate, and explain human aesthetics and its historical development
- · Diversity Outcome: View the world from cultural perspectives other than their own
- Natural Science Outcome: Incorporate empirical evidence in the analysis of the causes and consequences of natural phenomena
- · Social Science Outcome: Think critically and analytically about the causes and consequences of human behavior
- · Mathematics Outcome: Analyze situations symbolically and quantitatively in order to make decisions and solve problems

General Education Requirements (Bachelors Degree)

Students planning to earn a degree are required to complete general education requirements with a general education GPA of 2.00 or higher. The general education requirements will be considered satisfied for students transferring to LSSU with MTA or MACRAO.
